Parent Approved Tips & Tricks

Choosing a post-primary school can be difficult. Here are some tips and tricks from parents who have made the journey.

Start early


The beginning of **4th class** is a good time to look at which schools might suit your child, and it leaves you with plenty of time to research your options before it is time to apply.



Choose wisely

- What type of school might suit your child Are they very academic? Do they have particular interests? What environment do they thrive in?
- Is it a fee-paying school and is this an option? Are scholarships available and does your child fit the criteria?

- Do they require **additional support** in particular areas or special needs resources?
- Which subjects are being offered by the schools?
- Which after-school or extracurricular activities do the schools offer?
- Location how will your child get there and how long does the commute take?
- What are the admission criteria? St. Peter's NS is not a feeder school for any post-primary school so check the category into which your child will fall to get an indication of how likely it is that they can get a place.
- Know your catchment area for some schools, where you live influences whether your child gets a place or not



Open Days

Schools usually have open days for parents and students. Be aware that they can clash as they typically take place during mid/end September. Another reason to start looking early!

Scholarships

Some fee-paying schools offer scholarships. They may have early application dates and timelines to be aware of.

Be Informed

Do your own research and talk to other parents as well as seeking support from the school if you need it.

Ask your child to make sure they give you the material that they receive in school – don't let them bury it at the bottom of their school bag.

Know your dates – application deadlines vary, and they change every year.

Top tip!

Apply for more than one school. Your child might not get a place in the school of their choice.
